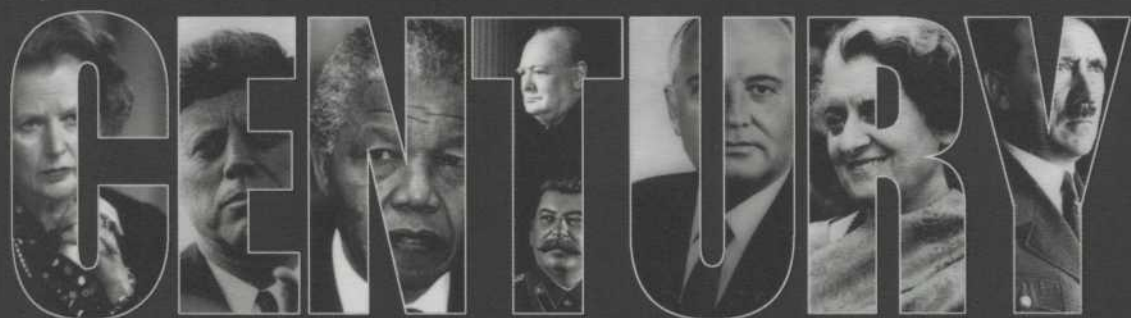

His narrative ranges from the many and bloody wars to the development of antibiotics, the crumbling of the European Empires, the assassinations of Gandhi, Kennedy and Rabin, the curse of Aids and the miracle of heart transplants, to the dramas of Suez, Hungary and Tiananmen Square, and the rise and fall of Communism.

Churchill wrote that 'It is called the century of the common man, because in it the common man has suffered most.' Untold millions of defenceless individuals – Chinese, Jews, Russians, Cambodians, Rwandans and many others – were murdered in cold blood by totalitarian regimes, and, while the inhabitants of some nations experienced unprecedented health and prosperity, those of others sank ever deeper into poverty, squalor and lawlessness.

This powerful history faces the horrors of the time yet also captures the details that bring an era to life – such as the invention of the hamburger or the advent of recorded sound – and it never loses sight of the fact that history is something that happens to ordinary people as well as to the great and famous.

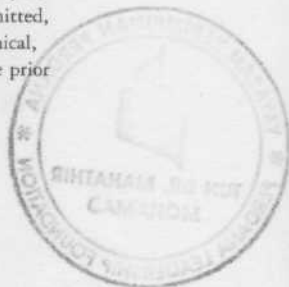
