## *Preface by Yves Messarovitch*

October 1992, I heard James Goldsmith deliver a lecture in the Grand Amphitheatre of the Sorbonne University in Paris. His audience of over 2,000 people consisted principally of European post-graduate students. That is when I decided that this book should be written. I saw my role not as a sparring partner in a debate but rather as a catalyst. I thought that it might be useful that the ideas expressed by Goldsmith at the Sorbonne be recorded.
