Malaysian Consulate driver murdered in Sydney  
2010/02/22

MELBOURNE: A Malaysian Consulate driver was stabbed and bashed with a hammer in Sydney on Sunday night.

Road rage is a possible motive for the murder of the 43-year-old man who had become an Australian citizen and had lived in Sydney for about three years.

As he arrived at his home in Marion Street in Sydney's inner western suburb of Leichhardt just after midnight, witnesses saw two men chase the victim across the road.

"We do believe that there may have been a traffic accident... shortly before the attack occurred," acting Superintendent Shayne Woolbank was quoted by The Daily Telegraph as telling reporters at the scene Monday morning.

Asked if road rage was a motive for the attack, Supt Woolbank said: "It is one of the possibilities".

The attackers were last seen fleeing the scene in a black sedan. Emergency crews were called to help the man, a Malay, who died despite the efforts of police officers who performed CPR.


"At this stage, we believe he has sustained some stab wounds and also some bruises and contusions," Supt Woolbank said.

Police confirmed that a hammer may have been used in the attack.

"It was a very ferocious attack, there is no doubt about that," Supt Woolbank said.

Dr Mohd Nasir Abu Hassan, director of the Malaysian Students Department in Australia, described the man as a "very dear colleague" who was unlikely to get involved in fights.


The victim's name has yet to be released. -- BERNAMA

The phenomenon of bashing and killing migrants in Australia has a long and consistent history. It was not only the mass killings of aboriginies but the massacres of the Chinese in the gold fields, the bashing and abuse of Italians, Maltese, Turks, Viet Nameese and other new arrivals like Arabs has been marked and treated as a "right of passage" by politicians in Australia who make light of it.

Strangely the attacks on Indians (and we are grateful to you for standing up on this issue unlike many settled Indians who act as baggage boys of the White Australian) has this time found resistance from the Indian community to a large extent and internationalised.

Julia Gillard's father and mother were Welsh pesants of this class.

Kevin Rudd is seen by many White Austrlains as an apologist for the Chinese government (mainland China). It was later discovered the Australian federal police and the Australian foreign office paid the girl and her mother to make the allegation against Julian Moti (he is Indian). They set him up because he would not cooperate with them. The same they now do with Anwar's accolytes in Malaysia who spread rumours about anyone who does not support Anwar.

There is a huge list of such state sponsored fixes which includes the bombing of the Hilton Hotel in Sydney in 1979 during the Commonwealth Heads of Government (CHOGM) meeting which ASIO and the Federal Police were implicated in. ### **IMF restores Zimbabwe voting rights**

WASHINGTON, Feb 20 — International Monetary Fund member countries agreed unanimously yesterday to restore Zimbabwe's voting rights after a seven-year suspension, a step toward normalising relations with major donors.

The IMF said, however, that Zimbabwe was not eligible for financial aid until it had cleared its arrears to the Fund and had a plan to pay off arrears to the World Bank and African Development Bank.

The arrears to the three institutions total about US\$1.3 billion (RM4.4 billion).

In an interview with Reuters, Zimbabwe Finance Minister Tendai Biti said key donors like the United States and Britain made strong statements of support for Zimbabwe during the IMF meeting but want to see more political and economic reforms.

"It's a major indicator that if we continue on the path of reform, on the path of stabilisation, and policy consistencies, we can achieve full reintegration and full support," he said.

The IMF suspended Zimbabwe's voting rights in 2003 over policy differences with the previous government of President Robert Mugabe. Western donors withdrew crucial funding for the southern African country and blamed Mugabe's land reform policies and mismanagement for the collapse of the once prosperous economy.

Mugabe formed a unity government a year ago with former opposition leader Morgan Tsvangirai, who is now prime minister. The IMF has said there are signs the economy is starting to recover due to improved policies.

Biti said that without addressing Zimbabwe's debt burden of close to US\$6 billion, including to the Paris Club of creditor nations, the country would be unable to recover fully from more than a decade of economic decline.

In a country where 85 per cent of the population lives below the poverty line and per-capita income is less than US\$400, Biti said it would be "immoral to take any dollar of our meagre resources" to pay off our debt.

"It is self-evident that we have to come to an understanding with the creditors and partners on our debt," he added.


But to win donor support for debt cancellation, Biti said Zimbabwe had to establish a track record of good economic and political decisions.

"(Donors) are preparing to support us but they are also rightfully raising certain issues that we have to deal with," Biti added.

Among those, he said, was a clear signal about the political direction of the country including the credibility of the political coalition, and progress in building a democratic state through agreement on a new constitution and strengthening the rule of law.

On the economy, he said donors wanted "clear signs that the economic stabilisation work we have done is not a flash in the pan and is an irreversible commitment."

Biti said an IMF team would next visit Zimbabwe in early March. — Reuters
