US soldier agrees to plea deal in Iraqi killings

1. A US soldier killed 24 Iraqi civilians, men, women, and children and was charged for manslaughter before a US military court.

2. US law allows for plea bargaining between the prosecutors and the accused person. Through this the soldier agreed that he would plead guilty if the charge is changed from manslaughter to dereliction of duty.

3. He was then sentenced by the court to reduction in rank to private, pay cut by two-thirds and three months jail.

4. We don't have provision for plea bargaining in our laws. When Anwar's Government takes over he will make our laws more modern, not so lapok(archaic) as they are now. Then those accused can bargain and the charge of whatever can be reduced so the accused can plead guilty to a lesser charge.

5. Just think, you kill 24 innocent Iraqis and get three months jail. That is justice.

No excuse for Perkasa over “white ang pows,” says Tee Yong

PETALING JAYA: Perkasa cannot be excused for giving out white ang pows at a Chinese New Year gathering on Sunday, said MCA Young Professionals Bureau chief Datuk Chua Tee Yong.

“Perkasa should have been aware. They should have learnt the practices of another race before organising such an event, so that they did not upset anyone,” said Chua.

He was responding to the function organised by Perkasa where Datuk Ibrahim Ali was seen distributing white ang paws to people, mostly senior citizens.

White packets is traditionally associated with the pak kam (white gold), which are donations given at a funeral.

MCA Youth chief Datuk Dr Wee Ka Siong tweeted: “Ang pow, in the Hokkien dialect, means red packet. If you want give an ang pow to your friends, make sure the colour is RED.”

Perkasa secretary-general Syed Hassan Syed Ali said they had no idea that “white” ang pow was taboo among the Chinese community.

“To us, white symbolises purity and sincerity. If we had known that it is wrong to give out white ang pow, we would not have done it,” he said.

Gerakan vice-president Datuk Mah Siew Keong said Perkasa should apologise for insulting the Chinese community.

“Being a member of parliament and (having been) in politics for so many years, Ibrahim is still so ignorant of the culture of other races, which is why he has kept making a lot of statements without thinking,” he said in a statement.
