No snag expected: Approval safe bet

NEW YORK, Wed.
THE United Nations announced last night that the Security Council would convene tomorrow at 3 pm to study the application of the Federation of Malaya for U.N. membership.

Malaya became an independent country in the British Commonwealth on Saturday and asked immediately for admission to the U.N.

The Council is expected to recommend the admission without opposition. This would open the way for quick approval of the application when the General Assembly opens its autumn sessions on Sept. 17,

Malaya would then become the 82nd member of the United Nations.

Meanwhile the U.N. received a cable from the Soviet-dominated government of Outer Mongolia renewing its request for admission.

This, together with the applications of South Korea and South Vietnam, probably will be taken up by the Council on Monday.

There appeared little likelihood, however, that any of these three would gain admission.
