Sheikh Mohamed Hussen bin Bakar Rafee, 82, who "praised Allah" when he read in the newspapers of Musa's and his wife's surrender to the government, said: "I'm so glad."

He said Musa joined the Al-Mashhur Islamic Religious School at Tek Scon Street here in 1930 at the age of 12.

Musa studied the Quran, Arabic and English until 1938 when he passed with flying colours.


Later, Musa became the head of the peasant's bureau of the Malay Nationalist Party (MNP)
