KUALA LUMPUR, Thurs. — Datuk Hussein Onn today announced the appointment of Jeneral Tan Sri Ghazali Datuk Seth as the new Chief of Armed Forces Staff to succeed Jeneral Tan Sri Haji Mohamed Sany Abdul Ghaffar, who will retire on Jan. 19.

The Prime Minister made the announcement after chairing a meeting of the Armed Forces Council at the Defence Ministry here.

Datuk Hussein, who is also the Defence Minister, said that the Deputy Chief of General Staff, Lt-Jen Datuk Zain Hashim, had been promoted to full Jeneral to become the new Chief of General Staff.

The new Deputy Chief of General Staff is Mejar-Jen Datuk Jaafar Onn, who has been promoted to Letnan-Jeneral. Datuk Jaafar is now Chief of Personnel Staff.

The commander of the 2nd Malaysian Infantry Division, Mejar-Jen Datuk Abdul Jamil Ahmad, has also been promoted to Lt-Jen to head the newly-created Army Corps Headquarters.

Datuk Hussein praised

Jeneral Tan Sri Sany for his outstanding services during his tenure as Chief of Armed Forces Staff.

Jen Tan Sri Mohamed Ghazali was born on Feb. 2, 1929 in Johore Baru, and had his early education at the English College there.

He was trained as a cadet officer at Eaton Hall in Britain and later underwent training at Sandhurst Royal Military Academy.

He was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant

in 1954.

In 1964, he was promoted to Lt-Kol and commanded the 1st Singapore Infantry Regiment.

Eleven years later, he was promoted again as the Deputy Chief of General Staff, and became the Chief of General Staff in 1977.

Jen Datuk Zain was born in Hamstead, London, and had his early education in Raffles College, Singapore. He joined the army in 1952.

He held various appointments, including the

Chief of Personnel Staff, commander of the 3rd and 7th Malaysian Infantry Brigades and commandant of the Malaysian Armed Forces Staff College.

Jen Datuk Jaafar Onn was born in 1939 in Singapore. He joined the army in 1962 and had his early army training in Britain.

Jen Datuk Jamil was born in Singapore in 1929, and joined the army in 1952. He had his army training in Britain and Australia. — Bernama
