

Nine-point accord ends MCA crisis

It's settled

PM witnesses signing ceremony

KUALA LUMPUR, Wed. — The MCA crisis has been settled. Leaders of the two rival factions put their signatures to a joint agreement witnessed by Barisan National chairman Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad and secretary-general Eneik Ghafar Baba today.

Under the nine-point agreement the 14 members who were expelled and those who were suspended would be reinstated after writing in to the party "to seek reinstatement."

For the Koon Swan faction, the signatories were former MCA Youth leader Datuk Lee Kim Sai, former central committee members Datuk Dr Ling Liong Sik and Senator Kee Yong Wee and suspended Kuala Lumpur municipality branch chairman Datuk Kok Wee Kiat.

There were smiles all round after the ceremony as members of both sides shook hands.
