KUALA LUMPUR,
Thurs. — The Prime
Minister is maintain-
ing complete silence
over the political situa-
tion in Sabah.

Asked to comment on
reports that three State
Assemblymen from the
ruling Parti Bersatu
Sabah (PBS) and one
from the opposition
Usno had resigned to-
day, Datuk Seri Dr. Ma-
hathir Mohamad said:
"I don't know, I haven't
heard. I haven't heard
anything."

He is, however, ex-
pected to meet Sabah
Chief Minister and PBS
leader Datuk Joseph
Pairin Kitingan tomor-
row.

The Prime Minister
~~did~~ in fact, indicate
this evening that such a
meeting was on the
cards. Asked when he
was meeting Datuk
Pairin, he replied:
"Tomorrow perhaps."

However, he declined
to comment on what
was likely to be dis-
cussed at that meeting.
All he would say was:
"He wants to see me. As
I said, anybody can see
me."

The Prime Minister,
who was very cautious
about matters related
to the political develop-
ments in Sabah, added
that Datuk Pairin
"didn't say" why he
wanted to see him.

The Sabah Chief
Minister flew in here
yesterday saying he
was seeking a meeting
with Dr Mahathir to in-
form him of the latest
developments.

He said he would also
submit a written report
to the Prime Minister.
