KUALA LUMPUR, JULY 23 (BERNAMA) -- DATUK SERI DR MAHATHIR MOHAMAD TODAY CALLED ON OTHER MEMBERS OF THE COMMONWEALTH TO JOIN IN THE BOYCOTT OF THE COMMONWEALTH GAMES SCHEDULED TO BEGIN IN EDINBURGH TOMORROW.

+IT WOULD NOT LOOK GOOD IF PEOPLE THINK THAT COLOUR AFFECTS OUR THINKING IN THE COMMONWEALTH,+ THE PRIME MINISTER SAID IN HIS REPLY TO HIS CANADIAN COUNTERPART, ENCIK BRIAN MULRONEY, WHO HAS SENT MESSAGES TO ALL THE COMMONWEALTH LEADERS SEEKING THEIR COUNTRIES' FULL PARTICIPATION IN THE GAMES.

DATUK SERI DR MAHATHIR'S REPLY WAS SENT BY WISMA PUTRA THROUGH THE CANADIAN HIGH COMMISSION HERE YESTERDAY.

HE TOLD HIS COUNTERPART THAT MALAYSIA'S DECISION TO BOYCOTT THE GAMES AND THE ARTS FESTIVAL WAS TAKEN IN VIEW OF THE UNYIELDING STAND BY PUAN THATCHER'S GOVERNMENT ON THE IMPOSITION OF ECONOMIC SANCTIONS AGAINST THE SOUTH AFRICAN REGIME.

DATUK SERI DR MAHATHIR SAID THAT DESPITE THE OBVIOUS DESIRE OF ALMOST ALL COMMONWEALTH COUNTRIES TO APPLY SANCTIONS, +I CANNOT UNDERSTAND HOW BRITAIN ALONE CAN INSIST ON HAVING HER WAY.+

HE SAID HE DID NOT SUBSCRIBE TO THE IDEA OF THE COMMONWEALTH'S EMINENT PERSONS GROUP (EPG) AS HE WAS NOT PRESENT WHEN THE DECISION TO SEND THE GROUP ON A SIX-MONTH MISSION TO THE SOUTH AFRICAN REGION WAS MADE DURING A WEEKEND RETREAT OF THE COMMONWEALTH SUMMIT IN BAHAMAS LAST YEAR.

THAT DECISION REPRESENTED A PARTIAL VICTORY FOR PUAN THATCHER WHO OPPOSED ECONOMIC SANCTIONS.

DURING THE CONFERENCE, COMMONWEALTH LEADERS HAD ARGUED THAT COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC SANCTIONS, WITH BRITISH PARTICIPATION, WERE THE ONLY WAY OF PUSHING SOUTH AFRICA TOWARDS MAJORITY RULE.

THE EPG'S REPORT ON ITS SIX-MONTH MISSION IN THE SOUTHERN AFRICAN REGION WILL BE DISCUSSED BY SEVEN COMMONWEALTH LEADERS AT A MEETING IN LONDON EARLY NEXT MONTH.

THE 116-PAGE REPORT OF THE MISSION, CO-CHAIRIED BY AUSTRALIA'S FORMER PRIME MINISTER MALCOLM FRASER AND RETIRED NIGERIAN PRESIDENT OLUSEGUN OBASANJO, WAS OFFICIALLY RELEASED LAST MONTH.

IT STOPPED SHORT OF DEMANDING FULL SANCTIONS AND LEFT THE QUESTION FOR GOVERNMENT LEADERS TO DECIDE.

COMMONWEALTH LEADERS HAVE GIVEN SOUTH AFRICA SIX MONTHS TO DISMANTLE APARTHEID OR FACE ECONOMIC SANCTIONS, AT LEAST BY ITS MEMBERS. -- BERNAMA
