**THE Pas-led Kelantan Government can take the Federal Government to court over the Hudud law issue, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad said yesterday.**

However, they can still enforce certain laws without going against the Constitution as it is their prerogative.

For instance, if they do not agree with the lottery, they can close the premises.

Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir also said if they do not agree with riba (interest), they can also stop issuing licences for banks.

Speaking after chairing the Umno Supreme Council meeting yesterday, he said it is up to the State Government to enforce the law.

"Hudud law is not only to chop off hands and heads. They can take us to court and we will explain to them the Constitution," he said.

He also said the decision to enforce the law only on Muslims is also up to the State Government.

On the appointment of an Umno Kelantan leader, Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir said the Supreme Council has not decided on the matter.

A Bernama report yesterday said the party may appoint an outsider to lead the party in Kelantan.

The Prime Minister said Culture and Sports Minister Annuar Musa is still the link between the Federal Government and the State Government.
