CUEPACS SEEKS DETAILS ON UNION'S ROLE IN MALAYSIA INCORPORATED

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 2 (Bernama) -- Cuepacs hopes to get a clear picture on Malaysia Incorporated to enable it play its role as a wise partner in the effective implementation of the concept, said its deputy secretary-general Haji Abdul Rahman Mana.

"Cuepacs fully supports the policy but are still vague on how members of public sector unions can assist in this noble aim," he said when contacted at his office here today.

On Thursday, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad had viewed the Malaysia Incorporated concept as complete with Cuepacs' participation after that of the government and the private sector.

Abdul Rahman said there was a need for a circular outlining the role of unions and their members as existing circulars were confined to role of individuals in the Malaysia Incorporated concept.

He also welcomed the government's move to include Cuepacs and Malaysian Trades Union Congress (MTUC) leaders in government's investment missions aboard.

Meanwhile, Cuepacs is still waiting for the 1996 appraisal forms 1966 which should have been distributed in the third week of October with the completed forms returned by the staff in November.

Abdul Rahman hoped the Public Services Department (PSD) would allow Cuepacs to have a look at it first as he was told there were a few additions. -- BERNAMA
