FOREIGN MINISTER TO VISIT CAMBODIA

KUALA LUMPUR, May 11 (Bernama) -- Foreign Minister Datuk Abdullah Ahmad Badawi will visit Cambodia for two days from Monday, his third visit to the Indochinese country in four years.

The Foreign Ministry said in a statement today Abdullah, who will be accompanied by two senior officials, will have talks with his Cambodian counterpart Ung Huot on bilateral, regional and international issues of common interest.

He will also make courtesy calls on First Prime Minister Prince Norodom Ranariddh, Second Prime Minister Hun Sen and National Assembly president Chea Sim.

Abdullah previously visited Cambodia in 1992 and again in 1994 when he accompanied Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

The statement said the visit next week, which is to reciprocate one made to Malaysia by Ung Huot last July, will enhance the existing two-way ties and cooperation between both countries. -- BERNAMA
