FORMER STATE ASSEMBLY SPEAKER DIES

PULAU PINANG, Oct 27 (Bernama) -- Former Pulau Pinang State Assembly Speaker Haji Sulaiman Ahmad, better known as Haji Sulaiman Palestin, 73, died in his father's house in Kampung Kebun Sireh, Bukit Mertajam, near here, today.

He was the speaker for 10 years from 1959 and was the Umno Youth deputy president in 1962.

He was admitted to the Cardiac Care Unit (CCU) of Hospital Pulau Pinang a week ago after suffering a heart attack and kidney failure.

He leaves behind two wives, Aishah Mahmud, 60, and Aminah Saad, 55, and six sons and two daughters aged between 17 and 38.

His nephew, Khairudin Abu Hassan 32, said Sulaiman will be buried at the Kebun Sireh Muslim Cemetery at noon tomorrow.

He said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad has been informed of the death and is expected to pay his respects at about 10 am tomorrow.

Haji Sulaiman who went to Mecca at the age of 12 used to reside in Mecca and Palestine for 21 years for religious studies.

He also travelled to India and was active in the International Youth Movement in New Delhi.

While in India, he had citizenship problem as the British government then did not recognise his Malayan citizenship but with the help of then Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, who accompanied him back to the Federation of Malaya, he was given back his Malayan citizenship.

Upon his return to Malaya in 1946, he became one of the founder members of Umno with Datuk Onn Jaafar, with the membership number "003".

During the first general election in 1955, he contested in the Nibong Tebal parliamentary constituency but lost to the Pas candidate, Haji Ahmad Hussin.

During the second general election, he contested on an Alliance ticket in the State constituency of Alma and won. He was appointed as Pulau Pinang state speaker for 10 years from 1959.

He was deputy head of Umno Youth from 1962 until 1963.

He was again active in the national political arena when he was appointed Umno Special Information Officer before being appointed Umno Information Chief on May 29, 1977 by Datuk Hussein Onn who was then Umno president.

However, he was relieved from his post as Umno Information Chief on April 9, 1978, for his "action and statement which contradicted party policy."

Sulaiman broke party tradition when he challenged Hussein for the post of Umno president in the 1978 party elections. He garnered 250 votes against Hussein's 750.

He also failed in his bid for a Supreme Council seat in the 1987 Umno elections and joined former Finance Minister Tengku Razaleigh Hamzah who formed Parti Melayu Semangat 46 (S46) and was chosen as a member of the S46 Supreme Council on Oct 12, 1989. -- BERNAMA
