Anwar hosts breakfast for visiting dignitaries

DEPUTY Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim and his wife, Datin Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail, yesterday hosted breakfast for several heads of states of Southern African nations and leaders of other countries at Technology Park Malaysia at Bukit Jalil.

The foreign dignitaries are in the country for the Langkawi International Dialogue. The annual dialogue ended on Wednesday.

Following breakfast, they toured the Technology Park Malaysia's facilities and was briefed by its chief executive Dr Mohamed Salleh Ismail.

Later, they visited Universiti Putra Malaysia's technology centre, the Putrajaya administrative capital and a luncheon at the KL International Airport in Sepang with Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

The Southern African heads of state who attended the breakfast were Botswana President Sir Ketumile Masire, Namibian President Dr Sam Nujomo and Swaziland Prime Minister Dr B.S. Dlamini.

Others in the entourage include Malawi Vice President J.C Malewezi, Ghanaian Vice President Prof John Evens Atta Mills, Uganda Vice President Specioza Wandira Kazibwe, Madagascar Vice President and Foreign Minister M. Herizo Razafimahaleo and Lesotho Deputy Prime Minister Pakalitha Misisili.

The other leaders were Jordanian Prime Minister and Defence Minister Dr Abdel Salam Al Majali and Mauritius Prime Minister Dr Navinchandra Ragoonam.
