CHANCE TO EXPLORE INVESTMENT PROSPECTS IN G15

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 31 (Bernama) -- A five-day business workshop beginning here tomorrow in conjunction with the G15 summit will serve as an opportunity to the private sector of member countries to forge trade and investment ties.

An official of the Malaysian External Trade Development Corporation (Matrade) said trade officials from Brazil, Egypt, India, Mexico, Jamaica, Algeria and Argentina are expected to give talks on investment climate, trade prospects and ways to do business in their countries at the workshop held at the Mines Exhibition Centre.

A G15 Business Exhibition and Malaysian Products Exhibition '97 are also being held at the centre.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad will officially open the exhibitions tomorrow, which are open to the public.

Meanwhile, 114 companies from 14 countries are participating in the G15 Business Exhibition, displaying a wide range of products and services including chemicals, steel and iron, automotive component parts, industrial equipment, textile and plastic products.

Ninety-three companies and agencies are taking part in the Malaysian Products Exhibition with specific emphasis on promoting Made-In-Malaysia goods.
