EX-SERVICEMEN'S ASSOCIATION WANTS THE US TO APOLOGIZE TO MAHATHIR

KANGAR, Nov 19 (Bernama) -- The Ex-Servicemen's Association of Malaysia (PBPM) today demanded that the United States apologize for its congressmen's insistence that Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad say sorry and step down.

PBPM president Datuk Muhammad Ghani said the congressmen should not interfere in the country's affairs as this could strain the existing relationship between the two countries.

"The PBPM criticises the 34 congressmen's action, who were envious of Malaysia, and demands that they immediately apologize to the government of Malaysia and to our prime minister," he said here today.

The congressmen demanded that Dr Mahathir apologize or step down for his alleged anti-Jewish remarks. -- BERNAMA
