London Dialogue receives good response

THE London Dialogue on Malaysia and British Partnership, scheduled to be held at the Queen Elizabeth Conference Centre, London on October 21 1997, has so far attracted a significant number of chief executive officers and fund managers.

Executive vice president of the Asian Strategy and Leadership Institute (Asli) Datuk Michael Yeoh, in a statement yesterday said that the Dialogue will enable British investors to have their questions answered and queries clarified during sessions with the Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Education Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak, and Securities Commission chairman Datuk Dr Munir Majid.

In his message to the London Dialogue, Dr Mahathir expressed hope that together, both sides can do more to enhance bilateral partnership and take it to greater heights in the new millennium.

British Prime Minister Mr Tony Blair in his message said, "Britain and Malaysia can work well together. The London Dialogue should chart a dynamic course in developing partnership between Britain and Malaysia, building on the strengths of the past and realising the potential for the future," he said.

The Dialogue is expected to be attended by 400 senior corporate executives, fund managers, institutional investors and academicians.
