Tajudin likely to be made NCCIM president

MALAYSIA Airlines chairman Tan Sri Tajudin Ramli, elected president of the Malay Chamber of Commerce and Industry on Saturday, is expected to be appointed president of the National Chamber of Commerce and Industry Malaysia in July.

NCCIM executive director Adnan Arrifin yesterday said the appointment would be made at the next executive committee meeting, as traditionally, the Malay chamber president is also made the NCCIM president.

Tajudin was elected the Malay chamber's president for the 1995-98 tenure, replacing the late Tan Sri Yahaya Ahmad who was killed in a helicopter crash.

Yahaya became the chamber's president in July 1995 when he was the only nominee as then the outgoing president Tan Sri Wan Azmi Wan Hamzah declined the post after holding it during the 1992-95 tenure.

He was speaking at a Press briefing in Kuala Lumpur on the Cyberpreneur Conference jointly organised by the NCCIM.

The other two organisers for the two-day conference - to be held from Aug 14 at Putra World Trade Centre in Kuala Lumpur - are Telekom Malaysia Bhd and Akademi TV3.

Among the key speakers will be Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Mimos Bhd president and chief executive officer Tengku Datuk Dr Mohd Azzman Sharifadeen, Multimedia Development Corporation executive chairman Tan Sri Dr Othman Yeop, Telekom Malaysia chief executive Datuk Mohamed Said Mohamed Ali and Mesdaq Bhd chairman Nasir Tun Razak.
