Bangsar Carnival attracts Dr Mahathir

PRIME minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad will be at Jalan Telawi 5 late tomorrow evening to officiate at the Bangsar Carnival to promote the Commonwealth Games.

The Bangsar promotion is part of the nationwide roadshow to promote the Games and sell tickets.

So, if you're planning a night out in Bangsar, catch some of the carnival activities and then head over to the KLBC (Kuala Lumpur Best Coffee) outlet in Jalan Telawi 3 and buy your tickets for the Games.

The tickets are already on sale and they will be available at the cafe till the end of the Bangsar carnival tomorrow.

KLBC is one of the few places in the Klang Valley where actual tickets for the Games can be purchased. Customers can buy tickets for daily sporting events as well as purchase redeemable tickets for the opening and closing ceremonies.

The ticketing booth at KLBC will be open daily from 12 noon till 8.00 to make it convenient for the public to purchase tickets.

The public can purchase their tickets via cash or credit card.

Tickets for daily events will also be available at the Ticket Express booth at Dataran Merdeka and nine Salem Power Station outlets around the Klang Valley.

As the commemorative opening and closing tickets are pre-printed, the public will only be given redeemable tickets from Salem Power Station and KLBC for these two events.

The commemorative tickets can either be couriered to the buyer for a nominal fee or exchanged at the Dataran Merdeka booth (with prior arrangement) or at Ticket Express courtesy booth at the Bukit Jalil National Stadium from Sept 9 onwards.

Customers who have not chosen to have their tickets couriered to them will be contacted by Ticket Express as to where and when their tickets can be collected.

The public are advised to buy their tickets from outlets or any of the over 60 certified vendors located across the country to avoid being duped into purchasing counterfeit tickets.

The tickets have very distinctive designs. The opening tickets carry the images of the various cultures and a scaled down image of the Bukit Jalil National Stadium.

The closing ceremony tickets have images of the New Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) and Petronas Twin Towers.

The daily event tickets use pictograms of the various sporting events.
