GREATER SIN IF DR MAHATHIR HAD NOT EXPOSED ANWAR'S SIN- MOHAMED

JOHOR BAHRU, Sept 27 (Bernama) -- Barisan Nasional (BN) secretary-general Datuk Seri Mohamed Rahmat today said the Prime Minister could not bear to harbour the greater sin of not exposing the sinful activities of former Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim.

He said as the country's leader who held fast to Islamic teachings, Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamed was prepared to face any challenges in upholding the truth.

Dr Mahathir's move was also to uphold the integrity of the race, nation and Islam because an immoral leader could destroy the country's future, Mohamed told reporters after attending Pulau Umno division Women's Day celebration here.

The function was officiated by Wanita Umno leader Datuk Dr Siti Zaharah Sulaiman who is also Deputy Health Minister.

"If a leader is immoral, how will he defend the sovereignty of the nation, race and Islam...because an immoral leader will do anything to satisfy his lust," said Mohamed who is the Information Minister.

He said the Prime Minister did not mean to defame Anwar but then he had concrete proof of Anwar's homosexual activities.

"The public may find it difficult to believe this but the truth will prevail and they will accept it when the case is brought to court," he said.

Mohamed also said the culture of demonstrations was not suitable for Malaysia because it had a lot of negative attributes that could lead to violence.

He said the present system of government was most suitable and would be continued to ensure national harmony.
