PPP to act against those causing trouble

KUALA LUMPUR, Sat. - The general assembly of the People's Progressive Party today unanimously passed a resolution empowering its supreme council to act against those causing trouble to the party.

It gave the council a mandate to act against 15 non-members who had claimed to be party members.

The general assembly was opened by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, who is also the Barisan Nasional chairman.

Also present were MCA president Datuk Seri Dr Ling Liong Sik, his deputy Datuk Lim Ah Lek and Parti Bansa Dayak Sarawak president Datuk Leo Moggie.

The assembly also passed a resolution pledging support to the leadership of Dr Mahathir and his Cabinet in addressing the economic problem.

Speaking to reporters, PPP president Datuk M. Kayveas said it would seek the Attorney-General's Chambers' advice on how it could use the Societies Act to put a stop to the activities of those who were creating trouble.

"They are either non-members or those who have been expelled and are jealous of the party's progress," he said.

He said the party would report such cases to the Registrar of Societies or police if that proved to be necessary.

Closing the general assembly, Kayveas called on party members to work together to strengthen the party.
