Six bilateral agreements signed with Kyrgyz Republic

KUALA LUMPUR, Wed. - Six bilateral agreements have been signed to date between Malaysia and the Kyrgyz Republic, mirroring enhanced diplomatic co-operation.

Since relations began in 1992, significant progress had been made due to the strong foundation laid by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad and Kyrgyz Republic President Askar Akayez.

In a Press statement from the Prime Minister's Department today, it said the first meeting of the special joint commission formed to oversee the implementation of an economic study in Kyrgyz, ended today.

The economic study was jointly conducted by the Economic Planning Unit and the republic's Finance Ministry.

The joint economic study focused on 11 areas of the Kyrgyz economy and subsequently the special joint commission was formed.

The two-day meeting was co-chaired by EPU director-general Datuk Dr Samsudin Hitam and the republic's ambassador to Malaysia, Mambetjunus Abylov.

"There was an exchange of information about the current economic situation in both countries.

"The highlight of the meeting was the discussion on several measures to enhance trade, investment and technical co-operation."
