TNB HANDS OVER ELECTRICITY PROJECT TO BOSNIA

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 14 (Bernama) -- Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB) today handed over an electricity project package to the Bosnia-Herzegovina electricity authority as an aid to revive the electricity distribution system of the war-torn country.

The handing over of the project which included a distribution control centre (DCC) to manage the distribution of power to the country's capital, Sarajevo, was done by TNB's President and Executive Chairman Datuk Dr Ahmad Tajuddin Ali to Bosnia's electricity authority General Manager Meho Obradovic in Sarajevo.

The aid was a follow-up on the initiative taken by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad and the Malaysian Government to rehabilitate the war-torn country, TNB said in a statement released here.

"TNB has played an active role in providing both technical as well as financial assistance, of up to RM3.3 million, part of which is used to set up the DCC," it said.

The aid package also included training of seven Bosnian workers for four weeks at Universiti Tenaga Nasional (UNITEN) in 1996, a technical audit on the Tuzla Power Station and the establishment of a current state-of-the-art technology Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition Centre.
