UMNO RELEASES LIST OF RECIPIENTS OF SPECIAL BUMIPUTERA-ALLOCATED SHARES

KUALA LUMPUR, June 21 (Bernama) -- Umno today released the list of Bumiputera companies and individuals who obtained special Bumiputera-allocated shares and were granted commercial vehicles licences, in addition to the list of those awarded privatised projects released to the head of Umno divisions at the Umno general assembly yesterday.

The list is also displayed at the foyer of the Putra World Trade Centre where the general assembly is held.

It was released at the directive of the Prime Minister and Umno president Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad following allegations that the government and the party practise nepotism and cronyism.

The special Bumiputera-allocated shares were those approved between 1992 and 1997. The licences, for vehicles like express buses, factory buses, school buses, hired cars, taxis and container hauliers, were approved up to March 31, this year.

The list on details of well-established contractors, listed according to their class, was also released.

Among the individuals who obtained the special Bumiputera-allocated shares in 1993 were Datuk Ahmad Sebi Bakar (20 million shares), Mohamed Shah Tan Sri Abdul Kadir (10 million), Tan Sri Mohamed Yusof Mohamed (10 million), Arsam Damis (8 million) and T. Datuk Aisah Sultan Ahmad Shah (222,000), all of Insas Berhad.

Tunku Imran Tunku Ja'afar (6,416,000), T. Datuk Adnan T.Mansor (9,504,000), and Ismail Ibrahim (460,000), all of Minho (M) Berhad; Mohd Nazri Abdul Aziz (700,000), of Super Ent. Holdings Bhd; Hishamuddin Tun Hussein (3,095,516), of Nanyang Press (M) Bhd; Mej (R) Sulkifli Abdul Mokti (2,854,000) and Nik Kamaruddin Ismail (1,995,000), of May Plastic Ind. Bhd.

Tan Sri Elyas Omar (16,983,000), Datuk Mohamed Yeop Abdul Raof (16,983,000) and Tan Sri Nasruddin Mohamed (100,000), of AP Land Berhad.

Tan Sri Datuk Wira Abdul Rahman Arshad (1 million) and Muthanna Abdullah (238,000), of John Master Industries Bhd; Tan Sri Elyas Omar (8 million), Tan Sri Nasrudin Mohamed (11 million), Datuk Hanafiah Hussin (11 million), Tan Sri Mohd Khir Johari (11 million), Datuk Dr Abdul Majid Ismail (11 million) and Datuk Abdul Kudus Alias (11 million), of AP Land Berhad.

Among the individuals who obtained the special Bumiputera-allocated shares in 1995 were Mohamed Nazir Tun Abdul Razak (420,000 shares), of Gemtech Resources Bhd; Tun Ghafar Baba (5 million), of Pan Malaysia Cement Works Berhad; Tan Sri Musa Hitam (747,000) and Abdul Shukor Mohamed (747,000), of Bright Packaging Industry Berhad; and Senator Rahim Baba (14,131,000), of Gula Perak Berhad.

Among the individuals who obtained the special Bumiputera-allocated shares in 1996 were Mohamed Padil Harun (11,413,792), Datuk Kamaruddin Jaafar (4,700,592), Datuk Mohamed Sulaiman (2,812,500) and Tan Sri (Dr) Mohamed Ghazali Shafie (2,812,500), of Westmont Land (Asia) Berhad; Datuk Kamaruddin Jaffar (7,500,000) and Hamzah Zainuddin (7,500,000), of

Malaysian Mosaics Bhd.

Among the individuals who obtained the special Bumiputera-allocated shares in 1997 were Datuk Jaffar Mohd Ali (4,149,000), of Measuarex Corporation Berhad; Megat Fairouz Junaidi Megat Junid (53,334), of Talam Corporation Berhad.

The number of recipients of the special Bumiputera-allocated shares from 1993 to 1997, as listed, was 442 individuals from 173 companies.

A total of 118 recipients from 42 shares obtained the shares in 1993, 103 from 34 companies in 1994, 74 from 30 companies in 1995, 60 from 28 companies in 1996, and 87 from 39 companies in 1997.

A total of 47 Bumiputera companies secured the special Bumiputera-allocated shares from 1993 to 1997. Among the companies are:

The list of those granted commercial vehicles licences included 15 big express bus companies, among them Transnasional Express Sdn Bhd which was received approval for 245 licences, Express Nasional Berhad (184) and Hosni Ekspres Sdn Bhd (116).

Among the companies operating container haulage services included in the list are Kontena Nasional Sdn Bhd (822 prime movers and 3,307 trailers) and Konsortium Perkapalan Berhad (464 prime movers and 2,302 trailers).

Also listed are the 13 biggest taxi companies, including Selasih Muara (250 licences), Naza Motor (161), Public Cab (150) and Iringan Pedati (122).
