BN GOVT WILL CONTINUE TO ACCORD FULL RECOGNITION TO CHINESE SCHOOLS

SEGAMAT, July 3 (Bernama) -- Education Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak said today the question of whether Chinese Primary schools will continue to exist in Malaysia should not arise again.

The Barisan Nasional Government would continue to accord full recognition to National Type Chinese Primary Schools, he said when opening the Johor Branch Campus of the Tunku Abdul Rahman College here.
