RM4 BILLION FOR DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN KELANTAN IF BN WINS

TUMPAT, Nov 22 (Bernama) -- Kelantan Umno liaison chief Tengku Razaleigh Hamzah today promised to seek a RM4 billion allocation from the federal government to develop Kelantan if the Barisan Nasional (BN) succeeds in forming the state government in the Nov 29 general election.

He said the application would be made direct to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad who he was confident would succeed in leading the federal government under the BN after the election.

Among the development projects he proposed to seek aid for were infrastructure facilities and a university badly needed by the people of Kelantan, the BN candidate for the Gua Musang parliamentary seat told the constituents of Pasir Pekan, here.

The BN candidate for the Pasir Pekan state seat is Mohamad Sulaiman while the PAS candidate is Ahmad Yakob.

Tengku Razaleigh said: "Dr Mahathir has been briefed on Universiti Kelantan Darul Naim which will be set up as soon as the BN wins the election."

He said all the development projects to be implemented were for the comfort of the people who had had been left behind all this while because of the incapability of the PAS government.

"I promise to develop Kelantan so that the people live in comfort...PAS had clearly failed to make a better life for the people throughout its rule since 1990," he said.

As such, he urged the people to reject PAS and give BN a chance to rule the state and country.

"We reject PAS not out of hatred but because PAS did not do anything for the people and state," he said.

Meanwhile, speaking to the voters of the Wakaf Baharu state constituency, near here, he said efforts would continue to be made to unite the people who were split by PAS actions.

He said the disunity like having two imam for prayers and the boycott of Umno functions was a loss to the people because there was no consensus.
