KEADILAN CANNOT LAST LONG, SAYS MOHAMED RAHMAT

JOHOR BAHRU, May 2 (Bernama) -- Information Minister Datuk Mohamed Rahmat said today Parti Keadilan Nasional (Keadilan) would not last long as the people have started to reject the party's allegations against Umno and Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

He described Keadilan president Datin Seri Dr Wan Azizah Ismail's overseas trip to solicit support as a political conspiracy to topple Dr Mahathir.

" Her action can be regarded as an attempt to weaken the country," he told a media conference after opening the Pulai Umno division delegates' conference in Tampoi, near here, Mohamed is the division's head.

" There's no need for us to ask for external support because Malaysia attained its independence from the people's own initiative," he added.

Meanwhile, Umno veteran and former Johor Menteri Besar Tan Sri Osman Saat described Dr Wan Azizah's action as futile.

" If she is really a true Malaysian and loyal to the country and religion, she need not seek outside help to deal with problems inside the country," he said.

He recalled his struggle along with Umno forefathers for Malaysia's independence without seeking outside help.

He also advised Umno members to enhance the party's struggles and be prepared to face the challenges ahead in the coming general election.
