LDP WILL NOT LOBBY FOR ADDITIONAL SEATS, SAYS ITS PRESIDENT

KOTA KINABALU, July 4 (Bernama) -- The Liberal Democratic Party (LDP), a Barisan Nasional (BN) component in Sabah, will not lobby for additional seats in the next general election.

"There are not many seats, particularly in Chinese-dominated areas, for distribution...so we won't request for more," LDP president Datuk Chong Kah Kiat said today.

He said, however, that he was leaving the matter to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad to make the final decision.

"What is important is that all parties must work together to ensure BN's victory in the general election. After all, we have only four Chinese (parliamentary) seats in Sabah," he said.

He was speaking to reporters after opening the Api-Api LDP division's annual general meeting, here.

Besides the LDP and another Chinese-based party, Sabah Progressive Party (SAPP), the MCA was also keen on fielding candidates in the election, he said.

In the last parliamentary election, the LDP fielded its sole candidate for the Sandakan seat while SAPP contested in three constituencies -- Gaya, Tanjung Aru and Tawau.

LDP's candidate, Lau Ngan Siew, won the seat, beating his nearest rival, Ang Lian Hai of the DAP, by a majority of 3,074 votes.

Chong said he was confident of retaining Sandakan seat, should it be allocated to the LDP.

He also urged the Chinese community in the state to support all BN candidates, including those from Umno, to ensure continued development and political stability.

"We need a strong government under BN. I'm confident Malaysians today are still very much behind the BN," he said.

On another matter, Chong, who is state Tourism, Environment, Science and Technology Development Minister, said the Sabah government was reviewing the royalties from bird nest's harvest and studying the environmental impact of the harvesting activity.

"We hope to complete the study before the harvesters renew their licences at the end of this year," he said.
