MALAYSIA WILLING TO RELAX TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS ON TOURISTS

LANGKAWI, July 25 (Bernama) -- Malaysia is willing to relax its travel and visa requirements to accommodate the needs of foreign tourists, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad said today.

"We are very keen to have people stay a longer time in Malaysia and for that we prepared to relax on visa requirement", Dr Mahathir said before witnessing the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between Emkay Group and Golden Life Resort Berhad on accommodation rental of 220 chalets in the "Langkawi Lagoon", a new style of luxury-living project, here.

The RM250 million project, which is destined to be part of the new development growth for the resort island, will have 1,700 chalets and a blend of condominium and chalet living catering to the needs of foreign tourists.

Dr Mahathir said Malaysia was anxious to promote tourism as it could aid the country's economic recovery.

He said the government would try to accommodate as much as possible the needs of visitors including the Korean tourists as their country had registered very rapid recovery after the economic turmoil of 1997 and 1998.

Dr Mahathir said Korea would be the first country in East Asia to recover as its recovery was very strong.

Congratulating the Korean government for this achievement, Dr Mahathir said: "For us, the prosperity of our neighbours is something that we always welcome as their prosperity also helps our own prosperity".

Dr Mahathir said that when Korea became prosperous it would enable its citizens to visit Malaysia more often, especially for their first honeymoon.

The prime minister said that besides cementing friendship with Malaysians, and enjoying Malaysian hospitality, Korean tourists could also save money as the cost of living here was lower than in Korea.

Dr Mahathir also said that the relationship between the two countries had been very good, with lots of Koreans working here and contributing to the development in Malaysia.
