OPPOSITION HAS NO AGENDAS FOR DEVELOPMENT - ABDUL GHANI

KOTA TINGGI, Nov 23 (Bernama) -- The people should reject the opposition in the Nov 29 general election as they have no development agendas, said Johor Barisan Nasional (BN) chairman Datuk Abdul Ghani Othman.

Instead the people should provide solid backing to the BN as it had an excellent track record in governing the country apart from willing to seek solutions for the interest of the nation's multiracial society.

This had been the practise of the ruling party since the days of Malaysia's first Prime Minister Tunku Abdul Rahman Putera until now, under the leadership of Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

Abdul Ghani who is the Menteri Besar said this at the leaders meet the people function for the Tenggara state constituency here last night.

This tradition should be followed as the BN had proven that it had managed to pull out Malaysia from the economic slump, he said.

Hence those who supported the opposition would only invite splits and racial disharmony in the country, said Abdul Gahni.

He said the so called four-party opposition alliance calling itself the alternative front would not last long and expected to disintegrate after the general election as they had different ideologies.

Citing an example, Abdul Ghani said Parti Keadilan Nasional was the creation of street demonstrations and had made the former deputy prime minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim's issue its main agenda.

"This is not the way Malaysians voice their views and the BN government which placed importance on unity, peace and harmony prefers resolving all problems through talks," he added.
