## Shots of Twin Towers dominate photography contest

KUALA LUMPUR, Fri. - Magnificent shots of the Petronas Twin Towers' 41st floor on the occasion of the building's spectacular official opening grabbed most of the prizes of the recent National Press Club-Petronas Photo Contest.

Petronas chairman Tan Sri Azizan Zainul Abidin today presented the awards to the 50 winners of the contest when the results were announced.

They included 18 grand prize winners - 10 winners for the open category, five for the Press category and three winners for the staff category.

The contest was held in conjunction with the celebration of Petroliam Nasional Bhd's (Petronas) 25th anniversary and the opening of the Petronas Twin Towers on Aug 31 by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

Each of the grand prize winners received Formula One race tickets, holiday package to Langkawi for two, petrol voucher worth RM100 and a certificate.

National Press Club president Zainon Ahmad said almost 90 per cent of the entries featured the official opening of the Petronas Twin Towers. "The images received covered all the highlights of the opening and it was clear the photographers put a lot of thought to capture the striking pictures," he said.

The contestants had to send in five pictures of the towers taken between Aug 31 and Sept 10.

Zainon said the organisers received some interesting pictures taken from Tasik Titiwangsa but structural and architectural studies and sunrise or sunset shots were rare.

The youngest of the grand prize winners, Lim Way Liam, 18, said he spend three days at the towers to get his shots.

His winning entry was a picture of the towers' linking bridge taken from the highest point at the park.
