

# Chandra, Anuar" 'not getting party support'

KUALA LUMPUR: There seems to be a lack of support from Parti Keadilan Nasional leaders in defence of their two leaders who have come under attack on the pro-reformasi websites.

Deputy president Dr Chandra Muzaffar and secretary-general Anuar Tahir appear to be the only ones to speak up on the websites' protest campaign against them.

Others in Keadilan have either remained mum or chosen not to rebuke the webmasters' action in urging Dr Chandra and Anuar to resign from their posts.

The Keadilan website which is updated on a daily basis has also been conspicuously silent on the issue.

Party sources said a lawyer who visited Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim in jail recently was told the sacked deputy prime minister had not received any letter from the webmasters.

Anwar said he is concerned and values the struggles of the webmasters and asked that they continue

their struggle for reforms.

Four days ago, four popular pro-reformasi websites — *Laman Reformasi*, *Pemantau*, *Komentar Reform-Black 14* launched a campaign against Dr Chandra and Anuar and demanded they resign.

Another reformasi website, *Mahaftraun 2020*, joined in a day later seeking "justice in Keadilan."

The webmasters claimed the two leaders had failed to continue to carry forward the *reformasi* movement started by Anwar in September 1998.

In response, Anuar had said "we don't take instructions from people outside the party" and criticisms of Keadilan leadership from "anonymous characters" were not welcomed.

Dr Chandra said the duo would "not surrender to Machiavellian political manoeuvres."

Keadilan vice-president Tian Chua when contacted said the party would take note of the criticisms on the *reformasi* websites.
