

PM: Bigger win will send signals to Opposition

KLJALA LLJMPUR. Sat: The Barisan Nasional (BN) is aiming for a bigger majority in the Teluk Kemang parliamentary by-election fixed for June 18-

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad said a bigger majority will send a strong message to the opposition parties.

He said opposition parties feel that the results of the last general elections reflect a trend that the people are favouring them.

"The actual truth of the results is because of the lies spread by Pas and their success in using DAP and Keadilan for their own benefit," he said.
