Don't be misled by deviants out to cause unrest

KUALA LUMPUR, Sun. - The People's Progressive Party today urged the public not to be misled by any form of deviationist teachings by those out to incite racial unrest and disharmony.

Its president Datuk M. Kayveas said the people should instead focus on enhancing racial harmony.

He said members of deviationist groups, especially those who are also political party members, should realise that their activities were not only jeopardising the future progress of the country, but also theirs and that of their families.

"The PPP strongly opposes all forms of deviationist teachings and stands behind the Government to maintain the peace, political and economic harmony which had long formed the foundation of the country," he said after chairing his party's supreme council meeting here.

The party will hold its general assembly in October this year, where Kayveas will defend his post for the third time. The assembly will be opened by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

Kayveas also urged all non-political associations to join PPP as associate members to assist the party in its various community-oriented programmes and activities.
