MUSEUM TO HOLD RARE EXHIBITION ON PERSIAN MARRIAGE CONTRACTS

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 7 (Bernama) -- The Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia will hold the first ever exhibition on Persian marriage contracts here for three months from Dec 12.

The exhibition on "The Sacred Art of Marriage - Persian Marriage Contracts from the Qajar Period", scheduled to be launched by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, is being held in conjunction with the museum's second anniversary.

The exhibits, belonging to the National Archive of Iran, are from the personal collection of Shourideh Ghazi, a statement from the museum says.

The museum, located at Jalan Lembah Perdana neighbouring the National Mosque and the Islamic Centre, here, is open to the public from 10am to 6pm, Tuesdays to Sundays.

The entrance fee is RM8 for adults, RM4 for students and senior citizens and RM3 for schoolchildren in unifrom in a group of 30, while children below 6 enter free.

The museum is a non-profit organisation dedicated to be the custodian, preserver and educator of Islamic Arts.
