Rampas to constituents: 'I'll do my best'

KIULU, Fri. - Kiulu Assemblyman Lovis Rampas has given an assurance that he will do his best to obtain government funds to maintain the infrastructure in his constituency.

He said there were many roads which had never been maintained while there were areas without basic facilities.

Lovis visited several villages yesterday to explain to the people his plans to develop the constituency after his recent defection from Parti Bersatu Sabah to Parti Bersatu Rakyat Sabah, one of the State Barisan Nasional component parties.

"I have been meeting the people everyday since I returned from Kuala Lumpur where I met federal BN leaders including Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

"I will be seeing the district officer and other authorities to get their support for development in Kiulu," Lovis said.

He also recommended that the present tamu or open air market grounds be extended closer to the scenic Kiulu river bank.

He said the Tuaran district council should also reconsider plans to move the market closer to the shophouses as this might create conflicts between market traders and shopkeepers.

"The traders in the market sell goods which are also available at the shops. The shopkeepers may not be happy," Lovis said. Kiulu town is about 45km from Kota Kinabalu.
