THIRTY RESOLUTIONS FOR PPP GENERAL ASSEMBLY

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 10 (Bernama) -- Thirty resolutions ranging from education to economy are to be presented at the People's Progressive Party annual general meeting at the Putra World Trade Centre (PWTC) here beginning Saturday.

Its president, Datuk M.Kayveas, said among the resolution was to urge the the government to fully support all primary Tamil schools which currently number 527 in the country.

The party would also suggest that a fund be set up to help critically ill patients in need of financial assistance for treatment, he said.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, who is Barisan Nasional (BN) chairman, would open the two-day conference, he told a media conference, here, today.

A total of 4,000 delegates and 1,000 observers will attend the conference.

Kayveas, who has been returned unopposed for the third term, said eight candidates would vie for the three vice president's posts and 52 will contest for the 25 Supreme Council seats.

Current vice-presidents Low Pooi Chai, A.Ayyathurai and S.Subrayan will defend their post.

PPP has 3,700 branches in 10 states except Terengganu, Kelantan and Sarawak, with 300,000 members.
