YPEIM INTRODUCES THREE "AMAL JARIAH" SCHEMES

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 1 (Bernama) -- The Malaysia Islamic Economic Development Foundation (YPEIM) today introduced three schemes to enable the public to make "amal jariah" (good deed) contributions through the latest technology.

With the introduction of the E-Jariah, Tele-Jariah and Auto-Jariah schemes, YPEIM has become one of the earliest local socio-economic institutions to use the multimedia approach to collect contributions from the society.

At the same function, YPEIM also launched its two existing schemes namely the "potongan Gaji" (salary deduction) and "Korporat Penyayang" (caring corporate).

The schemes were simultaneously launched with the national-level "Beramal Jariah" campaign by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad at the Pusat Islam here.

Through the E-Jariah scheme, contributors need only to visit the www.e-jariah.com.my or www.ypeim.net.my websites or the website of finance institutions like the www.maybank2u.com.

The contributions can either be paid through one lump sum, monthly, annually or through credit cards.

The public can also make their contributions through the Tele-Jariah scheme by dialling the infoline 600-86-7757 or through Maybank's Kawanku Phone Banking (Maybank). Each call charge is considered as contribution to YPEIM's "Amal Jariah Fund".

The Auto-Jariah scheme enables contributors to use facilities of financial institutions like the Maybank Auto Debit and Bank Islam (M) Bhd's (BIMB) Standing Order. Holders of BIMB smart card can make their contributions through the BIMB Auto Teller Machine (ATM) network nationwide.

The E-Jariah, Tele-Jariah and Auto-Jariah schemes are jointly developed with institutions like the Maybank, BIMB and Syarikat Telekom (M) Bhd.

Meanwhile the salary deduction scheme is to enable salaried staff in the civil and private sectors to contribute for "amal jariah" programmes by agreeing to their salary being deducted at least RM1 through their employers.

The caring corporate scheme is for corporate figures and bodies to contribute or sponsor amal jariah programmes offered by the YPEIM for a period of at least five years.
