KUALA LUMPUR, Fri. — Many Malaysians visited the United States Embassy today to express their condolences to victims of the terrorist attacks in New York and Washington on Tuesday.

The lobby area where the signing of the condolence book took place was filled with hundreds of flowers sent by people around the country.

Among those who signed the book today were Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Works Minister Datuk Seri S. Samy Vellu and Foreign Minister Datuk

Seri Syed Hamid Albar.

Peter Ansley, an American, said he was very touched by the kindness and support Malaysians have shown.

“I am very sad that tragedy has struck but I know Americans are strong and they will catch the culprits who ruined the lives of many,” he said.
