AGONG RETURNS HOME, WARDED FOR FURTHER TREATMENT

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 18 (Bernama) -- The Yang di-Pertuan Agong, Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah today returned home from Singapore where he underwent medical treatment for almost two months and is warded for further treatment at the Gleneagles Intan Medical Centre here.

According to an Istana Negara statement signed by the Prime Minister's Department's Senior Deputy Secretary-General, Kol Datuk Mohamed Shaid Mohamed Taufek, Sultan Salahuddin arrived on board a special aircraft at the Bunga Raya Complex at the KL International Airport (KLIA) in Sepang at 6.15am.

He was met on arrival by the Regent of Selangor, Raja Idris Shah, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Samsudin Osman, members of the Selangor royal family and Istana Negara officials.

Sultan Salahuddin then proceeded to the medial centre.

"His Majesty is in stable condition. The public need not worry over His Majesty's health condition," the statement said.

Sultan Salahuddin was admitted to the Mount Elizabeth Hospital in Singapore on Sept 20 for a medical check-up and was warded for a week.

He was readmitted to the hospital on Oct 2 and underwent a minor surgery to have a pacemaker implanted on Oct 6.

Dr Mahathir and Datin Seri Dr Siti Hasmah Mohamed Ali arrived at the medical centre to visit His Majesty at 11.25am.

They were met on arrival by the medical centre's chief executive officer, Stuart J.V. Pack.

Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi and Datin Seri Endon Mahmood arrived at the medical centre at 11.45am.

Dr Mahathir and Abdullah came down together from His Majesty's ward at 12.10pm.
