Call to build more RMC-type colleges

SEREMBAN, Sun. - Cuepacs wants the Government to build more training colleges similar to the Royal Military College to get more non-Bumiputeras in the civil service to promote national unity.

Its president Datuk N. Siva Subramaniam said more of such set-ups should be constructed to encourage the Chinese and Indians to be involved in Government service, such as the armed forces and the police.

"Cuepacs welcomes the Government's effort to increase non-Bumiputera representation in the civil service. At the same time, we want to see more Bumiputeras working in the private sector."

He was speaking at a dinner hosted by the Negri Sembilan National Union of the Teaching Profession last night.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad said non-Malays were fairly represented only in the diplomatic service but not in the armed forces or the police.

The Prime Minister added fair representation of the races should not only be restricted to Government service but it should be reflected in the private sector as well.

Siva Subramaniam added more programmes was needed to unite Malaysians and work to the creation of a Malaysian race.

"We will work closely with the Government on this."
