CUEPACS TO HOLD ASSEMBLY TO EXPLAIN SECURITY SITUATION IN COUNTRY

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 16 (Bernama) -- Cuepacs will hold an assembly here early next month to explain the current security and economic situation in the country to leaders of its affiliates.

Cuepacs president Datuk N. Siva Subramaniam said today Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad was expected to address the more than 300 affiliate leaders on the second day of the two-day assembly.

"We want all union leaders to understand what is happening in Malaysia and their contribution in developing Malaysia...we want them to go back (to their members) and explain the situation and what needs to be done," he said in an interview with Bernama at Wisma Bernama here.

He said the Home Ministry and the National Economic Action Council (NEAC) would also be asked to explain the country's security and economic situation at the assembly so that the message would reach the 950,000-odd civil servants and the people.

On the government's proposal to implement a ruling requiring civil servants to sign a good conduct undertaking, Siva Subramaniam said Cuepacs had already given its views to the government on several matters it disagreed with.

One of them was the word undertaking which the umbrella union body felt should be changed to civil service ethics to symbolise a civil service of international standard, he said.

"The conditions of the undertaking should not be a threat to civil servants but should instead motivate them to help the government machinery run smoothly," he said.
