FOREIGN MINISTERS INDULGING IN HOMOSEXUAL ACTS IN M'SIA TO BE ARRESTED

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 2 (Bernama) -- Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad said the government will arrest any foreign ministers involved in homosexual or unnatural sexual activities while in Malaysia as such acts are against the law of this country.

He said that as guests of this country, they must respect Malaysian law.

"Here, (if) they do it, they will be arrested as such activities are unlawful...(foreign leaders who) come to this country must obey our laws, and (similarly if) we go there, we obey the British law," he told reporters today.

He said this when asked on his interview with the London BBC Radio 4 programme yesterday where, among other things, he warned homosexual male British ministers that Malaysia would "throw them out" if they come to this country with their male companion.

The prime minister said he would accept any legal action if he was arrested while abroad for violating the laws of that country.

Although homosexual activities were a "private matter", if the foreign ministers intended to bring their male companions to attend the country's official function, then it would no longer be considered as a private matter because it would be a public function, he said after chairing the Umno Supreme Council meeting here.
