OSU ADVISES CIVIL SERVANTS NOT TO BE PREOCCUPIED WITH ROTATION ISSUE

KOTA KINABALU, Feb 26 (Bernama) -- Sabah Chief Minister Datuk Osu Sukam today called on civil servants in the state to be focused on their jobs and not be pre-occupied with the Chief Minister's rotation system.

Irrespective of the decision that will be made by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad on the rotation system, civil servants can be assured that the state government will continue to function as usual, he said.

"They should not be thinking too much on whether the rotation system is on or not but pay more attention to their duties," he told reporters today after a ground-breaking ceremony for nine blocks of low-cost apartments and 60 units of light industrial buildings in Inanam, near here.

Osu Sukam also said whether the rotation system for the Chief Minister's post will continue or be abolished is the prerogative of the Prime Minister.

Meanwhile, the RM60 million residential cum industrial project is being jointly undertaken by Warisan Harta Sabah Sdn Bhd, Hajat Melangit Sdn Bhd and Wah Mie Group.

He added that the developers have given their assurance that they will not transfer any costs, including interest payment on loans, to buyers in the event the project runs behind schedule.
