

# Mohamad Sabu to continue with insults

ALOR STAR, Mon. — Mohamad Sabu, the controversial Pas leader currently under attack for condemning Umno leaders in his speeches, is one very unperturbed person.

In fact, he has promised that he will continue and ensure future criticisms were equally scathing if not stronger.

“What I have said is the truth. I called Dr Mahathir (Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad) *haprak, gila* (mad) and will not put a stop to it,” he said.

Mohamad, who is Pas central committee member and Kuala Kedah Member of Parliament said he used the same approach of attacking Umno leaders at his *ceramah* (talk) in Suka Menanti in the Anak Bukit constituency.

One of the issues raised in the *ceramah* was the use of English to teach Mathematics and Science in schools, which he claimed most Malays in the country were not happy with.

Despite wide criticism of his actions, the Opposition leader is getting support from party members who believe he is fit to continue representing them in Parliament.

A banner depicting his picture with the wording *Teruskan Suaranya Di Parlimen* (Let His Voice Continue To Be Heard In Parliament) has been strung across a road into a village in Alor Piai to express their support.

Anak Bukit and Pengkalan Kundor State constituencies, which come under the Kuala Kedah parliamentary constituency, were won by Pas in the last general election.

The other constituency — Kubang Rotan — is currently being held by Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Syed Razak Syed Zain.

Pas acting president Datuk Seri Abdul Hadi Awang and his counterpart in Parti Keadilan Nasional, Datin Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail were among Opposition leaders campaigning in the by-elections.

Pas leaders also had a hard time explaining hudud, which the Barisan Nasional has gone to town with.
