

PPP Youth to pass 45 resolutions

KUALA LUMPUR, Mon. — PPP Youth is expected to pass 45 resolutions at its general assembly next month, including one urging the Government to ban political parties which misuse religion to gain political mileage.

Its chief T. Murugiah said the actions by these parties were jeopardising unity in the country.

Another resolution, he said was to ask authorities to stop allowing Employees Provident Fund contributors to withdraw their money to purchase computers and even houses.

He said many of the contributors abused this privilege and in their old age found they did not have the financial resources for themselves.

Murugiah said the movement also wanted the Government to intensify efforts to eradicate the problem of gangsterism.”

More than 1,000 delegates are expected to attend the assembly at the Putra World Trade Centre on Sept 1, scheduled to be opened by Barisan Nasional Youth chairman Datuk Hishammuddin Hussein.

The delegates are also expected to pass a resolution asking Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad to continue leading the country as long as he is able to.

“All delegates at the assembly will sign a memorandum asking Dr Mahathir to stay on.

The movement will also pass a resolution asking the Government to amend the Federal Constitution to guarantee the future of Tamil and Chinese schools in the country.
