# We'll take complaints in stride, says PM

**CYBERJAYA:** Complaints about Cyberjaya will not be ignored but taken with great interest, as the success of the country's premier intelligent city depends on it.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad said the government will listen to complaints to improve Cyberjaya.

"We want every business here to succeed. We are always prepared to listen to them, not only during yearly Budget dialogue, but any time at all.

"If you have any complaints or suggestions, we would like to hear them and we will see if we can do something about them," he said when launching the DHL Asia-Pacific Information Services facility here yesterday.

The RM200 million facility is one of three strategic global Information Services centres for DHL Worldwide Express.

Mahathir said the government wants to provide a good environment for people operating in Cyberjaya where scientists, entrepreneurs and innovators could meet at any time in a congenial environment.

He hoped that the current infrastructure would be adequate for companies operating there but stressed that the government would continue to improve on the infrastructure.

Mahathir recalled that when Cyberjaya was proposed, there was scepticism. But the project had now turned into reality and was growing, he said.

He added that many companies which had moved to Cyberjaya had expressed their desire to acquire more space.

He later met the MSC International Advisory Panel. All the advisory members gave the MSC the "thumbs up".
