
Interview me at home, says 'Raja Commando'

KUALA LUMPUR: Raja Kamarudin Raja Abdul Wahid, or "Raja Commando", who was implicated in *The Sun's* front-page story about a plot to assassinate Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahatir Mohamad, has refused a police request for an interview.

Raja Kamarudin, who is the Parti Keadilan Nasional deputy division chief for Shah Alam, said the police should come and see him at his house if they wanted to interview him.

"I received a call from Bukit Aman this morning for me to give a statement. However, I think I'll stay

at home," he said. "I'm not going to make the trip to the police station. If they want me, they can record the statement at my house," he said, when contacted at his residence in Klang yesterday.

Raja Kamarudin added that he would want his lawyer to be with him should the police wish to record a statement.

On Tuesday, *The Sun* reported that "Raja Commando" had been hired by several local politicians to assassinate Dr Mahathir and Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi.
