

Dr M's advice reflects high hopes for Puteri

CLEARLY Umno president Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad harbours deep hopes for Puteri Umno to make a difference in Umno and its politics.

Opening the Puteri Umno inaugural general assembly yesterday, Dr Mahathir said he had high hopes for this young movement to become strong and a key player in advancing the nation, the Malay race and religion.
